- 2016 Young Women (16 29) Pregnant or Parenting one Child





- A Home for Her
- Program not as resourced as we would have liked – no subsidies – co-habitation model
- In NB Social Assistance is \$537
- Negotiations with Landlord 2 bedroom -\$700 all in
- Program fee \$350
- Advocate with Social Assistance 2 cheques to one address

- Transitional & supportive
- Several program guildelines to ensure safety and comfort of everyone
- Mandatory programming
- Success Story: The Golden Girl
- Gaps:
  - Harder to house women
  - Women with children







- Partnered with local shelter for women a little pot of money for subsidies
- 6 NB Housing units 3 and 4 bedroom units
- Lessening of program rules In the business of housing people, not of evicting them
- Gap:
  - Pregant teens & Teen moms





- First male-led family
- Success Story Grandpa steps in
- Focus changes towards Housing First in our Scattered Housing Program
- The work begins for a new home for YWCA Moncton and housing for pregnant teens & teen moms









- Launch of Transitionelle Capital Campaign
- We find a property and plan renovations
- Negotiations with Landlords \$625 all in for HF
- Secured Funding with Department of Justice we expand our program
- Success Story Mama Bear



- YWCA Moncton moves to its new home
- Gap:
  - Emergency housing for non-VAW
- A Home for All:
  - Single individuals (HF & non-HF)
  - Couples (HF & non-HF)
  - Families (Women & Male-led)
  - Pregnant teens & teen moms

The YWCA Moncton A Home for All Housing Program is designed to provide safe affordable housing, for single women and mothers who are homelessness.




A HOME FOR ALL
