Preliminary Findings

Data - 2012-2015 overall family shelter

usage

- 1. 91% of head of households are lone
- 2. parent mothers
- 3. Most use only one shelter
- 4. Families stay longer than adult singles in shelter
- 5. Families have very different cultural backgrounds than adult singles



Preliminary Findings

Data

- 1. 45% Indigenous
- 2. 38% other cultures
- 3. 17% Caucasian (compares with 59% adult singles)



Barriers

1. Structural

immigration policies, jurisdictional issues, eligibility, childcare, housing

2. Social

interference, lack of 'healthy, reliable social supports

3. Emotional

embarrassment, shame, fear,

4. Informational

lack of awareness, inconsistency of information



Themes

- 1. Conceptualizations of Violence (all women)
 - IPV, structural, familial, multiple
- 2. Cultural complexities
 - loss of papers, change in status, complex systems, lack of appropriate supports
- 3. Children
 - sickness, safety, identity, normalization
- 4. Systems (child welfare, income support, housing) complete distrust and fear, punitive
- 5. Resiliency/hope
 - hopes and dreams, kids needs come first, kids as motivators for change,



Interviews with staff

- 1. Interagency collaboration and timing
- 2. Short-term housing for stabilization (as part of a continuum)
- 3. Flexible and mobile funding
- 4. Increased stock of affordable housing
- Review of agency eligibility particularly for housing
