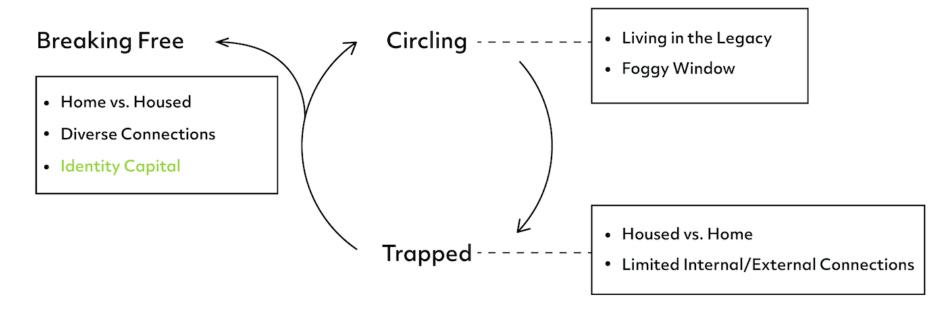

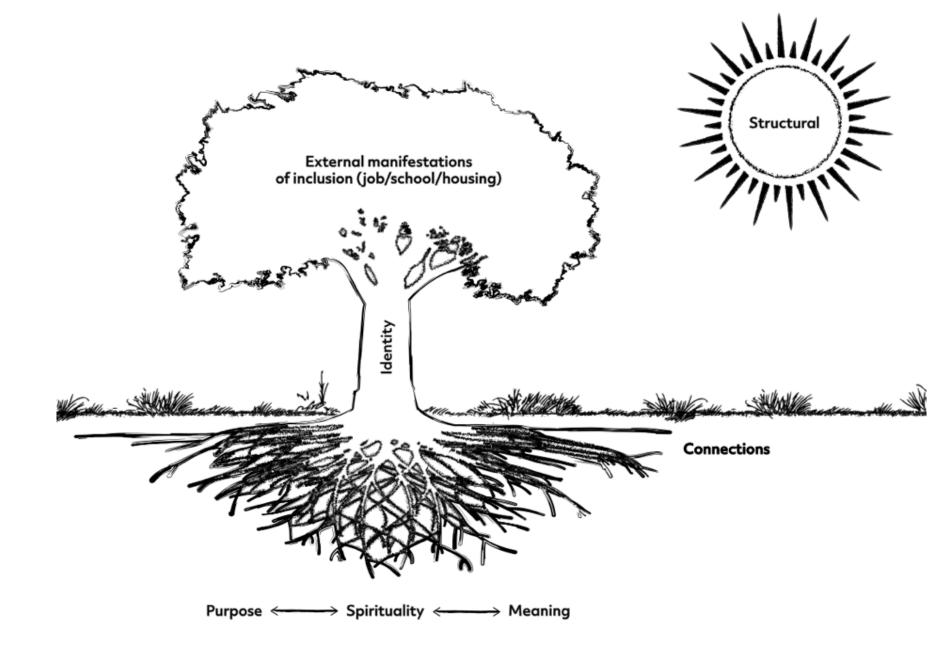




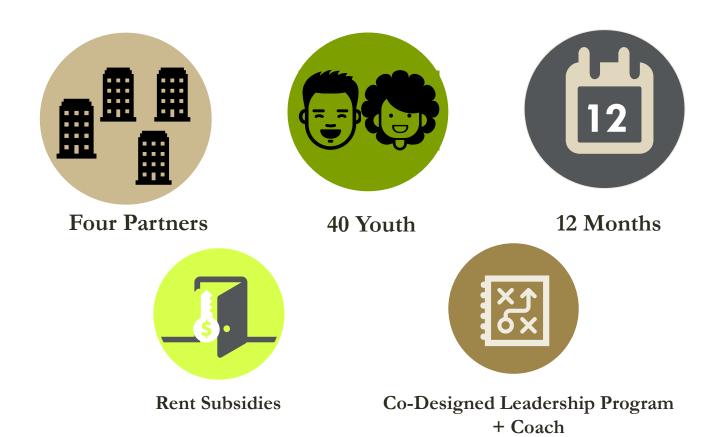
"Scholar **Julie Christensen** further describes the Indigenous concept of home as a feeling of "rootedness," meaning that an Indigenous person, community and Nation feel at home when they have a reciprocal responsibility and stable relationship with such things as place, geography, animals, community, sense of belonging, identity, family, ancestors, stories and independence (Christensen, 2013)."

"Without these connections, Indigenous Peoples feel "rootless," unanchored or "homeless" (Christensen, 2013, p. 809)."





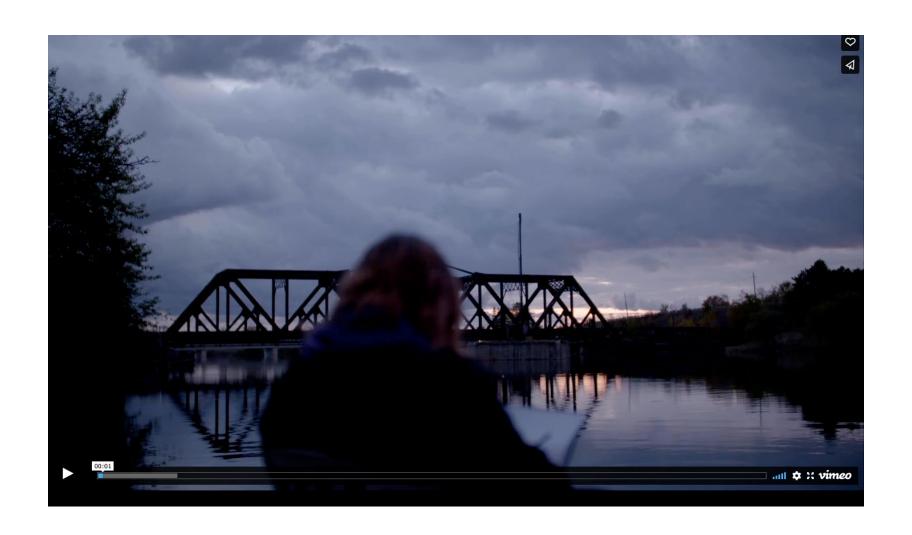
