

What is The Upstream Project?

The best way to address youth homelessness? By working upstream to prevent it from occurring first place.

- The Upstream Project will take innovative approaches developed in Australia and adapt them to the Canadian context.
 - The Geelong Project (TGP)
- Working with schools and local community agencies, The Upstream Project will identify students who are at-risk and connect them with the wraparound supports they need.



Why Schools?



School-based Prevention

Virtually every young person who becomes homeless **was in school at one point**, and was very likely in contact with an adult (teacher, guidance counselor, coach) who knew something was wrong.



Flexible Service Delivery Model

Core Principles:







- 1. Transform the way we respond to youth homelessness by **shifting the focus to prevention**
- 2. **Support Canadian communities** with planning and implementation of school-based prevention programs based on the TGP model
- 3. Noticeably reduce school drop-out rates, family breakdown and involvement in crime
- 4. Significantly increase school engagement, graduation rates and access to safe, stable housing
- 5. Reduce the number of young people who experience homelessness


Host Homes

Host Homes offer an alternative to emergency shelters for youth, with members of the community opening their homes to provide safe accommodations for young people at-risk.

Host Homes can achieve the following benefits:

- Enable youth and their families to resolve issues
- Ease the transition to independent living
- Reduce isolation
- Prevent youth who are leaving care from entering the youth homelessness system
- Create longer-term stability for youth within their community


Host Homes: National Scaling

Raising the Roof is currently working with 360°kids and Nightstop UK to scale their Host Homes model across Canada

- Raising the Roof will record key learnings from the pilot projects conducted by 360°kids' Nightstop (York Region) and Bridging the Gap's Host Homes (Halton Region)
- These key learnings will then be incorporated into the Nightstop model which Raising the Roof will pilot in additional communities
- The program will then be scaled across Canada
