

- Develop a framework to address anti-Black racism



ADVERTISEMENTS. TEN DOLLARS REWARD.

DUN-AWAY from the Subscriber, A NegroSlave named Ishmail about 35 years old, 5 feet 8 inches high, pretty much marked with the Small-pox, wears his own Hair which is blick, long and corty; has black Eyes, broad Shoulders, and tone of voice peculiar to New England, where he was born; reads English tolerably well, and can fpeak a little Franch: He had on an old Hat bedambed with white Paint, an Oseabrig Frock and Trowfers, a check

Shirt, a thort white flanned Jacker, and a pair of Mochindians.

If any person apprehends taid N E G R O, and given notice thereof to
the Solicinder living at the Baton-gate, he or she shall receive TE N DOLLARS Reward, befides all resionable Charges; but, whoever carries him off. entertaint, or employs him after this public notice, will be profered according to Law. , JOHN TURNER.

FIRST AFRICAN IN THE COLONY OF NEW FRANCE

- Mathieu Da Costa
- · Arrived in 1604 as a multilingual interpreter

1600s-1834 SLAVERY

- Canada's earliest documented occurrence of slavery was in the early 1600s.
- Slavery was abolished in 1834, but discrimination persisted.

1700s-1980s

RACIAL SEGREGATION

- Black people were systematically segregated and denied access to education, employment, housing, transportation, immigration, healthcare and commercial establishments.
- The last segregated school closed in 1983.

1900s-1967 **IMMIGRATION**

In 1910, the Canadian government implemented an Immigration Act barring Black immigrants.



1900s-PRESENT

PLANNING & SEGREGATION

Urban planning has historically and systematically contributed to the racial segregation and displacement of racialized communities. Unfortunately, these discriminatory practices continue to this day.

Anti-Black Systemic Racism as a Pathway to Housing Instability

Justice System

"They put you in the system at a young age. They put a curfew on you, and you can't go to work. They call your house, and if you are not there, they arrest you. You are in the system."

Education

Employment

"I worked with youth who would call me a Nigga. Being the only Black person in my job, I couldn't talk to other people about it."


Healthcare





- There is an emergent need to address anti-Black racism
- Anti-Black racism is embedded in every institution
- Lack of culturally appropriate services and representation
- Anti-Black systemic racism acts as a pathway to housing instability and homelessness



Anti-Black Systemic Racism as a Pathway to Housing Instability

JUSTICE SYSTEM:

"They put you in the system at a young age. They put a curfew on you, and you can't go to work. They call your house, and if you are not there; they arrest you. You are in the system."

EMPLOYMENT:

"I worked with youth who would call me a Nigga. Being the only Black person in my job. I couldn't talk to other people about it."

HOUSING:

"They only want a certain race to rent they would say Indian, Asian or something like that. When you search it up on Kiji, you would notice."

EDUCATION:

"They treat White kids better than us. For little things, you get into trouble and suspended for weeks. They don't give you chances."

"I met with a mental health navigator and did not feel understood. What would be helpful is someone that understands my background."

Severe lack of data on Black Canadians. In 2020. Black people were 3.7 times more likely to experience homelessness in Vancouver.

DATA:

FOOD INSECURITY:

In 2018, Black adults were 2.8 times more likely to experience food insecurity.
