



Speaking to the Stories... voices of defined homeless

"Yes there is homelessness, but no one is on the street."

- South East

"I stay with guys every night, but sleep with them to spend the night. I come to the Friendship Centre to warm up."

- East Central

"Mental health and additions is the number one problem."

North East

"shelter jumping from community to community"

- West Central

"At Our House you have to be out by 7:30...

I go to Share a Meal at 3:00, meet friends.

> Go to the Friendship Centre, hang out and have coffee. Go to Walmart, a 20 minute walk..." - East Central

"I am an Elder and I currently have 8 people living with me. I live in a 2 bedroom house, and am also a foster parent. I grew up with my mother helping people in the same way. Would I feel lonely if they all left? YES. Many Elders take in family members."



Can't be done in Isolation...

lessons learned from service providers

"Aboriginal people need their own place that is **culturally appropriate**."

- South West

"Best practice is to **remove jurisdictional barriers – don't care where you are from**, we will still help. It is a constant battle if you mandate means you can't help some people."

- North East



"... strong beliefs, rooted in culture, about family and taking care of others; someone will always open their doors to a homeless person in dire need, and indeed, families often see it as their responsibility to house relations who might otherwise not have a home."

- North West

"High turnover rate, except those that are from here." - North West

"There isn't a lot of turnover. **If you are from here, you stay here to help**."

- West Central
