Since the start of the pandemic, CAEH has invited communities they work directly with (through Built for Zero Canada or the Training & Technical Assistance program) to participate in a survey every one to two weeks.


Second Wave




On October 14, the World Health Organization (WHO) confirmed that Canada is experiencing a second wave of cornavirus cases. With many leading experts warning that the second wave will be harder than the first, communities are grappling with how to protect our vulnerable homeless neighbours, while caring for staff and being mindful of limited resources.

Top 3 critical concerns about the second-wave






Emergency Shelter Response

57% of communities report an **DECREASED** by 10 - 45%


of communities report an **INCREASED** by 8 - 100%

The vast majority of participants report that most (if not, all) emergency beds/units allow for physical distancing.




Unsheltered Homelessness




50% of participating communities report that there is sufficient space within their emergency shelter system for people who are sleeping unsheltered

All participatingn communities report that they are providing in-person outreach to people experiencing unsheltered homelessness



Testing & Outbreaks

65% of participants report that their community is offering some onsite testing at shelters, encampments, and/or isolation and quarantine shelters.



Housing-based Responses

Affordability and availability of housing is a challenge for nearly every community. Participants were asked to indicate if other issues have become more of a challenge, less of a challenge, or have remained the same degree of challenge, compared to pre-pandemic.
