

The Australian Context

- Over 24,000 Victorians & 116,000 Australians will be homeless tonight.
- Homelessness in Australia has risen 30% in the past decade.
- Every day, 261 people are turned away from homeless services due to a lack of housing & resources.
- Aboriginal people represent 22% of the homeless population despite making up only 3.3% of the Australian population.





The Australian Context

On Census night 2016

18,625

people over the age of 55 were experiencing homelessness ¹

Older Australians represent 16% of the homeless population (or 1 in every 6 people experiencing homelessness) ■ Where do they stay? ¹

Policy Change

The Australian Aged Care Act provides for the funding of aged care services.

As of 2009 the aged homeless were finally acknowledged as a special needs category under the federal aged care principles. Years of advocacy finally paid off.





Budget Comparison

 In 2019-20, the Australian Government will provide \$1.56 billion through the ongoing National Housing and Homelessness Agreement

 In 2019-20, the Australian Government will provide record funding of \$21.6 billion to Australia's aged care system















