

#### Why Argue for Trans Inclusion?

- 1. Not everyone is required to do this
  - But you might want to or have no choice
- 2. Backlash against trans rights
  - It is likely to reach spaces you are in at some point
- 3. Conversations allow people to change and grow
  - The long, slow work of persuasion



#### Five Arguments

- 1. Trans people have the right to be included
- 2. Access without safety is no access at all
- 3. Inclusion defeats fear
- 4. Base expectations on behaviour, not identity
- 5. Disproportionate need, disproportionate harm



# 1) Trans People Have the Right to Be Included

 2017: Gender identity and expression added to Canadian Human Rights Act

OHRC: Duty to accommodate trans people

Not perfect, but it's important



### 2) Access Without Safety Is No Access at All

 Inclusion based on sex at birth ignores safety

 Real inclusion only happens with safety, and safety requires choice




# 3) Inclusion Defeats Fear

False inclusion is based in prejudice


Prejudice is based on fear

 Inclusion creates positive examples, which breaks down fear



## 4) Base Expectations on Behaviour, not Identity

- That said, conversations about safety are important
- There will always be people who engage in predatory behaviour
- Clear norms for behaviour that are the same for everyone
- Reframe concerns rooted in transphobia as ones about behaviour



# 5) Disproportionate Need, Disproportionate Harm

 Trans people are more likely to need homelessness services

 When accessing services, trans people have distinct needs

 Harm is therefore disproportionate when services fail to be inclusive



#### What These Arguments Have in Common

1. Avoid defining what a man or woman is

Don't depend on the characteristics of individual trans people

3. Focus on the goal of inclusion



#### But What About...

- What about hardened transphobes?
  - Identify and confront, not necessarily convince
- What about trans-specific services? An alternative to inclusion?
  - No choice remains key
