IHII Mentorship

Key to the success of the project was an early injection of funding from the Indigenous Homes Innovation Initiative (IHII) program through ISC.

SUBMISSIONS

Out of 342 submissions, 24 projects were selected for the Accelerator phase

ACCELERATOR PHASE

Projects received up to \$350k and mentor support to refine concept plans

IMPLEMENTATION

18 projects including the Round Prairie Elders' Lodge were provided up to \$2 million to construct

COMPLETED

The Round Prairie Elders' Lodge is one of only two projects completed as of January 2022

Elder Engagement Session

The Elders who would call the building home were always central to developing the concept for the Lodge. Their stories inspired the design which was translated to the building by architect David T. Fortin. Storytelling was an important part of the project journey.





COMMUNITY INCLUSION

Tour of the Round Prairie Settlement

CUMFI's president Shirley Isbister invited the Big Block team to the Round Prairie settlement, the namesake for the Elders' Lodge. Having a connection to the place where Shirley and many of the Elders' brings the spirit of this settlement into Saskatoon

CUMFI as Developer

CUMFI was in the driver's seat throughout the entire process, with Big Block Construction, David T. Fortin Architecture, and other project partners offering guidance and support as CUMFI navigated a new construction project for the first time.



LEADERSHIP

Leadership to guide the project in terms of the initial concept and internal resources. Provide ongoing guidance and decision making to the project team. A shared vision is critical to project success.



GOVERNANCE

Leadership should remain governancefocused, keeping their decision making high-level and not getting into the weeds. Create the structure under which the project can be successful.




CLEAR MANDATE

Provide leadership with a strong and clear mandate of who and how the organization will help. Provide the tools to execute but more importantly the knowledge of what is important to the project.

Integrated Project Delivery



INNOVATION

Modular Construction





Modular construction technology was used to accelerate project delivery, ensure exceptional quality, reduce waste and emissions, and reduce local disruption.

Residential modules were constructed in a climate-controlled factory from April to June 2021 and craned into place in one day on July 6, 2021.

A hybrid construction approach was pursued, with the gathering spaces constructed on site using mass timber.



Net Zero Ready



The Round Prairie Elders' Lodge was constructed to the Net Zero Ready standard and is 42% more efficient than a reference code building.

- Savings of approximately \$2 million over a 50-year period
- Ability to support the installation of on-site solar generation
- High airtightness and insulation R-values, critical for energy efficiency in the Saskatchewan climate



ECONOMIC IMPACT

Indigenous Economic Reconciliation

Indigenous Involvement was a priority for the project, with Indigenous-owned companies receiving extra points in a selection rubric. Companies with Indigenous hiring policies were also awarded additional points.
