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HOMELESSNESS REDUCTION INNOVATION FUND

The Homelessness Reduction Innovation Fund provides one-time grants for projects aimed at achieving measurable reductions in homelessness.

HRIF grants will be distributed to communities for targeted, data-informed projects that measurably reduce homelessness. CAEH will offer one-on-one guidance and coaching to communities on their initiatives and share successful approaches with other communities across the country.

The Homelessness Reduction Innovation Fund is part of the federal government's commitment to Reaching Home: Canada's Homelessness Strategy, as announced in Budget 2024. This project is funded by the Government of Canada.



It also asks a series of questions under five sections that provide important context about your community that are not captured in other parts of the Workbook. The five sections are: General Overview, BND/CA Implementation Progress, HMIS and Other Software Tools, Understanding Your Data, and Partnerships & Engagement. CAEH requires that this tab is completed as part of CAEH confirmation of Quality By-Name Data Foundations and Coordinated Access Foundations. All elements required for confirmation are listed at the bottom of the Scorecards.	 ■ Key questions help to clarify the scope of your work, roles, definitions, and local data systems as well as surfacing important information to better understand your data and progress. ■ Completing these questions is ideally part of a conversation with your Improvement Advisor that will prompt important insights, and will improve understanding of your community to support your progress and better enable your Improvement Advisor to offer you relevant information and coaching.
