
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Context

- Development of the 2019-2024 Plan






10 THINGS TO KNOW...



3. Federal funding is critical to the St. John's homeless-serving sector



- Total funding \$7.9m
- Enhancements of \$1m in last 3 years (30%)
- CAUTION
 Sustainability
 planning is key!



4. City of St. John's and EHSJ enjoy positive working relationship

- "Incubation" of EHSJ through administrative and operational support
- Annual contribution \$100,000 cash, \$250,000 in-kind
- Support in new governance structure



10-Year Affordable Housing Strategy launched in 2018



5. Challenges in information management and real-time data

- Many community agencies using HIFIS 3.8
- Reduction in support for HIFIS 3.8 to focus on HIFIS 4
- Unclear timeline for full HIFIS 4 deployment




NL HMIS Catalyst Initiative for provincial HIFIS 4 implementation launched in 2018-2019



6. St. John's needs more low-barrier shelter capacity

- Some people barred from all emergency shelters
- Common for shelters to be full
- Lack of staffing and supports at for-profit shelters


Shelter capacity in St. John's





7. Strong desire to strengthen Coordinated Access

- Concerns re available capacity through CA
- Desire for more efficient process
- Overall desire for continuation and improvement





8. Public system discharge into homelessness is still an issue

- One of the 6 outcomes in the 2014-2019 Plan
- Discharge planning not consistent across sectors
- Need an address to qualify for income support








9. Youth vulnerable upon leaving the child welfare system

- Over 1/3 of CA participants under 30
- Housing options available for youth
- Aging out in provincial child welfare system
- Changes welcome by community








10. The best objectives and outcomes are SMART

- 2014-2019 Plan had 6 desired outcomes
- Only 2 had measurables
- Others not clearly articulated
- Area of improvement for 2019-2024 Plan






