Background

- **Population: Approximately 166,004 (2021 census)**
- **Greater Sudbury is geographically the largest city in Ontario and the most populous in Northern Ontario**
- **Overall vacancy rate for 2022 – 2.1% (CMHC)**
- **Average monthly market rent for a 1-bedroom apartment in 2022 - \$1,145 (CMHC)**
- **9.5% of population living in low income – 2021 census**
- **35.5% of the population are renting – 2021 census**
- **Point in Time Count- Oct 2021- 398**



Summary of CAEH 2022 Presentation

- **Co-ordinated Encampment Response in October 2021 in Memorial Park.**
- **Collaboration between MLEOs, Client Navigators and Outreach teams daily.**
- **By April 2022, all individuals were supported to leave the park and find more permanent housing solutions and no enforcement was required.**

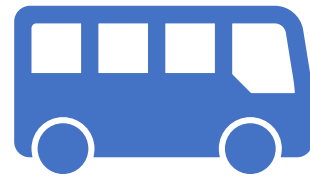

252 people active on BNL (Oct 30, 2023)	96 supported	143 supported	13 people currently supported
744 added in total - 305 have been housed	79 housed	Transportation, ID, First/Last month's rent, storage	46 people in total supported
