A Shared Aim: Functional Zero

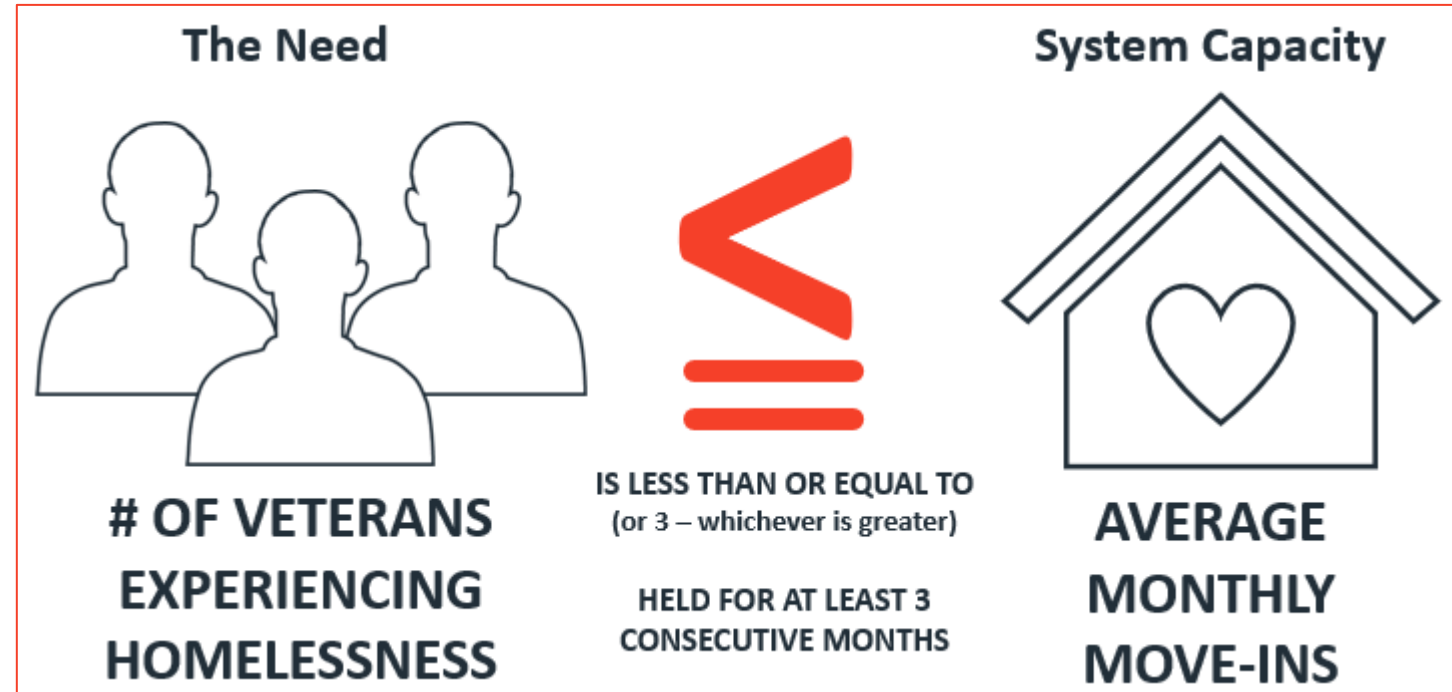

1. Homelessness is rare, and measurably so. Capacity of system to house people is equal to or greater than inflow
2. Operating on a full accounting of homelessness at all times with a By-Name List
3. Achievements are sustained over time

Measuring Functional Zero Veteran Homelessness

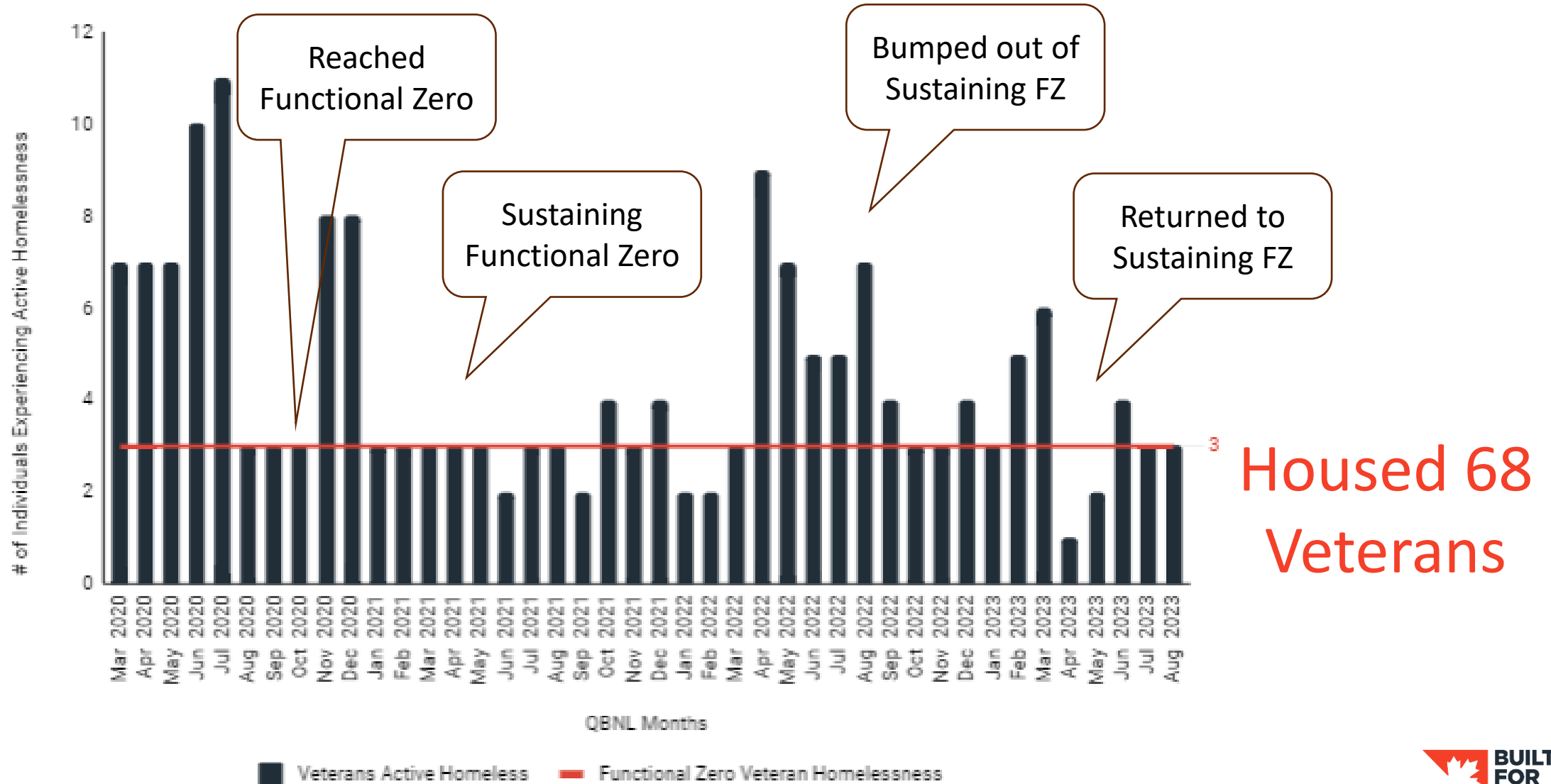
- When the number of veterans experiencing homelessness is less than or equal to the number of veterans a community has proven it can house in a month.
- The number of veterans experiencing homelessness must be held at or below this functional zero threshold for at least three consecutive months.
- 16/16 on the Functional Zero Veteran Homelessness Confirmation Checklist
