




Community Host Home Program

The benefits of becoming a Host Home include:

- Helping women and children be safe, secure and heal from the trauma they have experienced
- Contributing to ending domestic violence in your community
- The potential to develop a lasting friendship
- · Learning about social issues of interest and that affect your community







Welcome a Rowan House Family into your home!

Host home arrangements are highly individualized and dependent upon the needs of both the host and hosted families. The match between the families will consider factors such as:

- · the size and type of housing available
- · length of the living arrangement
- · remuneration agreement and
- personal and lifestyle suitability

Rowan House will facilitate a successful host home arrangement by:

- screening prospective Host Homes and Rowan House families for level of safety risk
- providing training on topics such as domestic violence and trauma
- introducing the Host and hosted families and support both parties in their decision about it being a suitable match
- providing on-going support to both the Host and hosted families
